Your Impact:



21 older adults secured stable employment.

93% of adults receiving day care services delayed need for long-term care.



226,000 meals served to 4,365 older adults.

1,279 household tasks and 586 rides provided to assist older adults in staying in their homes.

Your Impact:



2,449 nurse home visits to at-risk moms. 100% received prenatal care and 91% immunization rate by age 2.

2,732 individuals served through: crisis hotline, counseling, crisis day care, ER outreach, and more.



968 individuals provided 17,200 shelter days. 92% indicate they developed plans for continued safety.

After almost eight weeks at Children's Inn, Sheila found an apartment that would be a great home for her family. She was apprehensive, but had the tools she needed to succeed.

> **Your Gift:** \$1/week = 2 transportation fees to prenatal care

\$10/week = 3.5 days of shelter to a child who has witnessed domestic violence

Your Impact:



29 youth age 16-21 provided housing case management. Of those, 100% worked towards their high school diploma or GED.



47 families were provided a comprehensive wraparound approach to improve lives impacted by maternal incarceration.



465 individuals received 7,511 hours of counseling services last year.

Your Gift:

\$25=1 hour visit by a Family Coach to a mother in jail, beginning the process of reunifying a family

\$100 = 1 young adult with transportation to work for two months.





Funded Program:

After School and Out of School Program

Your Impact:

443 students participate in after school and summer programming that includes: reading assistance, math help, karate, and programs to recognize different cultures.

My children are very happy there. They come home at night, excited to share what they learned. And I am learning too. Their English, our English is improving quickly and their reading and math. -MCC Parent

Your Gift:

\$2/week = 2 students with snack for the school year

\$20/week = 100 hours of Native Counts tutoring, encouraging Native American students to increase their math skills

Funded Program:

Aquatics Child Care Girls on the Run/Heart and Sole Let Me Run Women's Workforce Programs Youth Recreation

As a mentor of a school-age boy, I have been able to provide him great opportunities with EmBe scholarships. He explored STEM skills and has learned to swim. -Volunteer Mentor

Your Impact:

316 individuals received interview suitings and access to career development tools, with 90% attaining employment.



1,709 youth participate in a variety of youth development programs.



127 boys participated in an after school program that uses running to encourage a healthy lifestyle.

Your Gift:

\$25 = 1 team of girls with a finisher's medal after completing their 5K, a visual reminder to "never give up"

\$20/week = 1 preschooler with a 15 week scholarship, to prepare them for kindergarten





Funded Program:

Counseling Services Education and Prevention Victim Advocacy

Your Impact:

557 individuals were provided counseling services and support, in facing the psychological, emotional, and physical effects of rape, sexual assault, and domestic violence.

After being told by others there was nothing I could do about being sexually assaulted and harassed, I came to The Compass Center, where I received help to make a police report and file a protection order. -Compass Center Client

Your Gift:

\$25 = 1 school classroom with a presentation on health relationships

\$2/week = 1 victim with an advocate in a local emergency room, which will increase the likelihood they gain access to necessary follow-up resources

Your Impact:

409 counseling sessions are provided each month at 40+ area schools.



1,081 people were provided with 6,316 hours of counseling.

In elementary school we played games. In middle school we started to do more talking about school and classes. In high school we just talk. I like to tell him about things in my life and I like to hear his stories. -USucceed student

Your Gift:

\$25 = 1 background check for a new volunteer mentor

\$10/week = 8 group transports to activities that explore career and higher ed opportunities

Your Impact:



68 children have access to a highquality pre-kindergarten experience.



2,710 refugee and immigrant students and their families were served, encouraging parental involvement and 96% met or exceeded district average attendance rates.

Your Gift:

\$4/week = 1 refugee child and their family is connected to a liaison

\$10/week = 64 hours of preschool instruction for one child

Avera's Family Wellness Program Success by 6/Parenting with Success Our girls have established positive relationships through counseling and continue to learn how to take care of themselves mentally and physically. And we continue to grow as their parents and as spouses through counseling. - Avera Family Wellness parent

Your Impact:

2,399 new parents received resource booklets after birth, providing info and resources for the start of the parenting journey.



286 children and their families received early intervention to build stability and address mental health.

Your Gift:

\$1/week = 8 families with a temperament profile and guidance techniques

\$2/week = 1 parent coaching session to provide education and support

The Club Eastside Club Early Childhood Education The Boys & Girls Club was a perfect fit for me because it had basketball and all of the activities I needed. There were a lot of kids from East Africa that we didn't know that came to the Club. So it became a place for us to come together. - The Club participant

454 children received quality child care that includes early childhood education curriculum.



358 youth participated in a safe, supervised, and engaging environment during out of school time hours.

Your Gift:

\$25 = 1 month of meals and snacks for one middle school student attending The Club

\$100 = 1 child with a variety of field trips to enrich their early childhood education

Crisis Care Genesis From the first day I went in there and talked to staff, I felt like I mattered, and my situation wasn't ignored. It was a huge relief to get help when I needed it the most. - Genesis participant

Your Impact:

1,811 individuals and families received financial assistance for shelter, utilities, or employment transportation.



84 households were paired with volunteer mentors who helped to stabilize them and increase financial literacy. 93% achieved or maintained permanent housing.

Your Gift:

\$2/week = 3 recently employed individuals with a 30-day bus pass for reliable employment transportation

\$10/week = 10 mentees with financial literacy tools and resources

211 Community Resources Network of Care Outreach Support Program Suicide and Crisis Support Volunteer Connections

Your Impact:

48,658 calls/emails/texts were answered an additional 31,036 inquiries were made online.

17,911 volunteer-related contacts were supported in the community.



818 people attended educational sessions about suicide and response and an additional 12,987 people were provided with survivor support.

Your Gift:

\$25 = 3 households with referrals for donated furniture

\$2/week =10 suicidal individuals with a series of follow-up calls to decrease their risk in the future

94 children were enrolled in a high quality early childhood education program

\$2/week = 4 adults to obtain a drivers license, providing transportation for employment and school

\$2/week = 1 tricyle for outdoor use for gross motor development

358 children and 353 non-offending family members were provided with crisis intervention and support.



2,666 new parents received a packet of info and resources at birth, 186 new parents received a home visit by child development professionals

\$25 = 2 new families with safety devices for Home Safety kits, allows a child to grow, play, and explore their home safely

\$10/week = 7 non-offending caregivers with a Family Advocate present during their child's interview
