1 older adult with social, cognitive, or physical limitations was given support through Active Generations' Day Break.

3 new parents received resource booklets, temperament assessments and other resources through Avera McKennan's Success by 6 program.

4 youths attended a safe, supervised, and engaged place that focuses on arts, education, and career development, health and life skills, character and leadership skills, and sports and recreation through Boys & Girls Clubs of the Sioux Empire's K-5 program.

7 people received counseling through Family Service.

1 family received furniture through the Furniture Mission.

1 individual with disabilities received therapeutic horseback riding, hippotherapy, or other services through HorsePower.

24 individuals received referral information through the Helpline Center's 211.

2 people were connected to the appropriate resources via a shared network to coordinate basic needs services through Helpline Center's Network of Care.

19 individuals received information and referrals to volunteer opportunities through Helpline Center.

1 individual and family was provided with financial support and resources after losing a loved one to suicide through Lost&Found's Survivors Joining for Hope program.

2 individuals and families participated in therapy and counseling services through Lutheran Social Services.

1 older adult was matched with an adult volunteer for social and recreational opportunities through Lutheran Social Services' Better Together program.

4 individuals received financial counseling, debt management, financial education, student loan counseling, credit report consultations and bankruptcy counseling through Lutheran Social Services' Center for Financial Resources.

1 disabled child and their siblings were provided with after-school and summer care through Lutheran Social Services of SD's Here4Youth program.

3 youths were provided with an adult mentor to establish a trusting relationship through LSS's In School Mentoring program.

1 student was provided professional mental health counseling sessions directly in their school through PATH.

15 new parents received information about their child's development and temperament through Sanford Childrens' Success by 6 program.
